Using a Fire Extinguisher

Fire extinguishers are provided at all Dauphin County Library System libraries. Please take the time to learn where all of the fire extinguishers for your building are located. If a fire occurs, be sure to activate the building alarm system, assist any persons in danger or who need help evacuating, and then attempt to extinguish the fire ONLY IF YOU CAN DO SO WITHOUT PUTTING YOURSELF AT RISK.

A simple technique for remembering how to use a fire extinguisher is offered at <u>http://www.ehs.okstate.edu/modules/exting/Howto.htm</u>. This is the **PASS** method.

Although extinguishers can vary in size, color and type of extinguishing agent, all devices operate basically the same way. If the fire is small and heavy smoke is NOT present and you have an exit available to you for evacuation purposes, grab the nearest appropriate extinguisher and operate following the **P-A-S-S** procedure:

- **P** *Pull* the pin located in the extinguisher's handle.
- **A** *Aim* the nozzle, horn or hose at the base of the fire.
- **S** *Squeeze* or press the handle.
- **S** *Sweep* from side to side at the base of the fire until it is out
