At its core, The Library is about building a stronger community - together.

Each day, we see what that truly means. We see children discovering the joy of reading, families learning and growing side by side, and neighbors finding a welcoming space where they feel they belong. These moments may

feel small, but together, they shape a more connected, informed, and compassionate community.

Because of your support, this work continues to grow in meaningful ways.

In 2025, more than 2,400 people participated in our Summer Reading Challenge, reading over 59,000 books and 2.2 million minutes. Through our new Book Dash program, we delivered 1,092 books to 364 homebound residents, ensuring that access to stories and learning reaches beyond our walls. One participant shared, "Any books I receive really make a pleasant day."

We also expanded opportunities for connection and discovery. Families attended their first symphony performances, explored museums, and engaged in programs that spark curiosity and creativity. Across our libraries, more than 510,000 visits and 40,000 program participants reflect the vital role The Library plays in everyday life.

These numbers tell an important story - but you are the reason behind them.

Your generosity ensures that The Library remains a place where literacy in all its forms - reading, digital, financial, and civic - can flourish. You help create a space where individuals grow, and in doing so, strengthen the entire community.

We are grateful to partner with you in this work. Together, we are not only meeting today's needs - we are helping build the kind of community we all want to live in.

On February 1, 2025, The Library hosted a reception commemorating the bicentennial of the Marquis de Lafayette's historic visit to the new state capital in Harrisburg in 1825.

The reception took place in the historic parlors of the former Governor Schulze mansion where Lafayette visited on February 1, 1825. Today, it is known as the Haldeman Haly House and is home to The Library's administration offices.

The event was sponsored by Enders Insurance and The American Friends of Lafayette. Special guests included Monsieur Michael Halbert as Marquis de Lafayette and David Biser as John Harris, Jr., with Betsy Barnicle providing period music. Event partners included Pennsylvania Heritage Foundation, Historical Society of Dauphin County, Historic Harrisburg Association, and the Harrisburg Chapter of the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution.

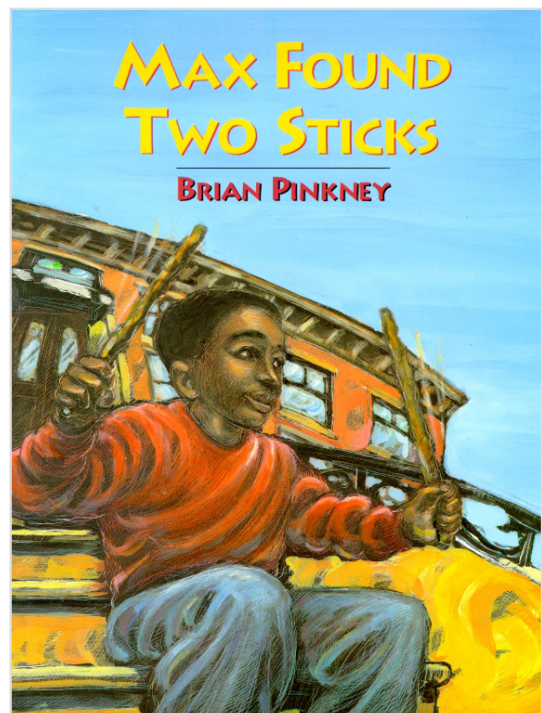

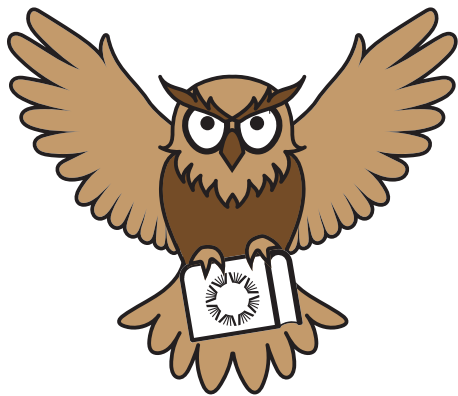

Bringing the Library to You

A community member who has received books from our Book Dash program writes,

“Several weeks ago I received two books from your library as I was receiving meals on wheels. That was the nicest thing I could have...Any books I receive, really makes a pleasant day!”

In partnership with the **Dauphin County Area Agency on Aging (DCAAA)**, The Library began providing books or books-on-CD to home-bound residents who participate in the Home Delivered Meals program. Through the new Book Dash program, The Library uses Community Collection items to provide each participant with 3 books or books-on-CD of their selected genre each quarter. Library staff, volunteers, and Friends of The Library fulfill these orders, bundle items, and ready them for pick-up. DCAAA volunteers deliver the book requests along with the home delivered meals. There were 364 participants and 1,092 books delivered.

DCLS.org Gets a New Look

Early in 2025, DCLS.org got a major refresh. The redesigned website makes it easier to discover information, events, and items in our catalog by simplifying navigation and consolidating content into fewer, clearer pages. It also prioritizes ADA accessibility so everyone in the community can easily use and benefit from The Library’s online resources.

Books *on Tap*

In 2025, the William H. and Marion C. Alexander Family Library celebrated a full year of Books on Tap, our book club that meets at Rubber Soul Brewery in Hummelstown. We have a revolving group of members who attend as their interest in that month’s selection and availability permit, and all newcomers are warmly welcomed. It’s a fun way for people to connect and create community.



Level Up at Your Library

The Summer Reading Challenge isn't just for kids! More than 2,000 Dauphin County residents of all ages read along with The Library's Level Up At Your Library Summer Reading Challenge in 2025. Together, we read 59,012 books and for 2,204,681 minutes. The Library held two Super Cool Book Parades to kick

off Summer Reading. Parades were held at Halifax Area Middle/High School and at The Salvation Army in Harrisburg with more than 400 books given to young paradegoers. Throughout the summer, Dauphin County Library System branches hosted a variety of programs, including

Give Meeples to the Peoples

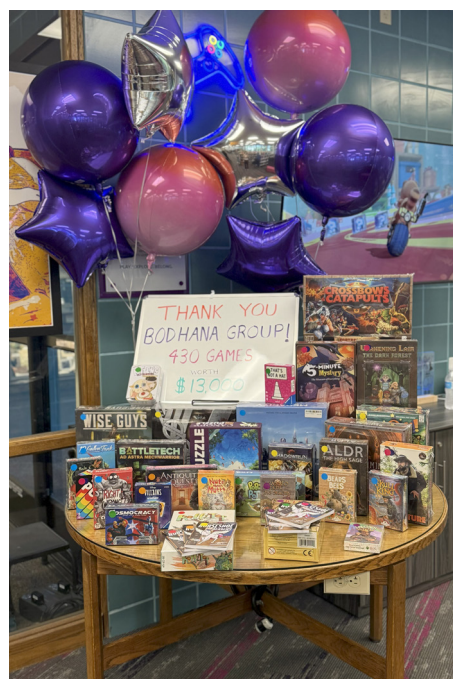
In October, The Bodhana Group donated 430 games to The Library through its Give Meeples to the Peoples initiative, curating a collection of board games for each of our eight branches.

Board, card, dice, and role playing games all inherently provide the opportunity to build skills such as reading, writing, arithmetic, socialization, manual dexterity, deductive reasoning, etc. Role playing and storytelling games provide a nurturing and safe environment where people can work through trauma, anxiety, and other emotional issues through the medium of play that replicates and borrows from other techniques.

The Bodhana Group is a nonprofit organization that advocates the use of tabletop gaming as a unique technique of therapy and treatment. Their trained staff are experienced group facilitators as well as storytellers, with years of practice in both worlds.

Supporting Students Without School Libraries

Dauphin County Library System branches are fulfilling the role of school libraries for students of all ages.

At the **McCormick Riverfront Library** in downtown Harrisburg, kindergarteners and 5th graders from Harrisburg Catholic Elementary School began using the branch as their school library in 2025. Kindergarten through 8th grade students from St. Stephen's Episcopal School visit the library regularly for library instruction from our youth services specialist there..

Johnson Memorial Library is unique in that the public library is connected to the Millersburg Middle School. However, the students no longer have access to a library during school hours. As a result, Johnson Memorial Library has become an after school gathering place for students to do homework and to play.



The Power of a DCLS Library Card

DCLS launched partnerships with the **Harrisburg Symphony Orchestra**, the **Susquehanna Art Museum**, and **Open Stage** to allow library patrons the opportunity to experience culture and the arts for free with their Dauphin County Library System library card. The program continues to expand with **Fort Hunter Mansion** and the **National Civil War Museum** to be added in 2026.

Planting a Seed to Nurture Our Community

Come grow with us! A seed library empowers community members to learn more about agriculture, grow healthier foods, and create a culture of sharing. Members are encouraged to “borrow” seeds and then harvest the seeds from those plants and return them back to the library.

In 2025, a seed library was planted at East Shore Area Library. It was created as an Eagle Scout Service Project by Max Wilkerson, a member of Boy Scout Troop 77 in Harrisburg. To create the seed library, Max made wooden units, created flyers, developed instructions, and ensured the seed library would be sustainable and easy to use.

This is the second seed library for the Dauphin County Library System. In 2023, the Lend & Tend Seed Library and Mary’s Garden, a community garden named after longtime public services assistant, Mary Witmer, opened at the Northern Dauphin Library. The seed library and community garden were supported by a partnership with Penn State Health and a Rite Aid Healthy Futures Grant.



There were **90** checkouts at our **East Shore Area Library Seed Library** last year.

Foods grown include carrots, herbs, bush beans, peppers, tomatoes, cucumbers, zucchini, lettuce, radishes, and red beets.

More than 37 lbs. of produce were harvested.

Food grown was freely offered to people visiting the library and to a local food pantry (**Upper Dauphin Human Services**). Community members also were permitted to harvest their own produce from the garden.

CARROTS & CHIVES

The Carrots & Chives program presented by Edible Classroom at the Northern Dauphin Library had 9 youth and 9 adults participate. Attendees learned about companion gardening, and each family left with a five-gallon bucket of soil, established chive plants, and freshly planted carrots. This program was made possible through our partnership with Penn State Health and the Rite Aid Healthy Futures grant.

Kline Foundation Community Room Gets Some LOVing

A few minor changes can make a huge difference. Last year, the George & Hettie Love Memorial Library updated the Kline Foundation Community Room. New closet doors swing out to maximize accessibility. Six new tables that adjust to three heights are extremely versatile for programs from preschool to adult. A new pond themed rug adds to the fun, especially at storytime. The African American Quilters Gathering of Harrisburg gifted a beautiful handmade quilt featuring photos of the families of the library’s namesakes George and Hettie Love which is on display in the Kline Foundation Community Room.



Volunteer Excellence



The Dottie & Henry Swartz Volunteer Excellence Award Winner Natalie Kelley-Wilson began volunteering in April 2023 at the Northern Dauphin Library. Mary's Garden at the library could not exist without the dedicated help we receive from Natalie. From the beginning on garden build day to today, Natalie digs right in! She helps with planting, watering, weeding, and harvesting of the vegetables. Her service to Northern Dauphin library has a great impact on the community.

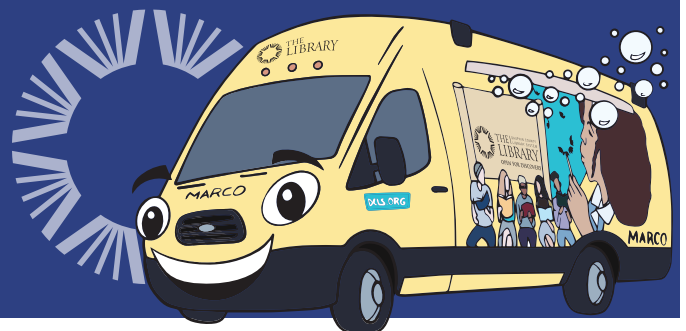

Grant Highlights


The Library is able to make an impact on our community with programs and services made possible through grants. These are a few highlights from 2025:

-  A \$20,000 grant from the Alexander Boyd and Jane Starke Boyd Foundation continued to fund the Dauphin County Prison Digital Library project.
-  A \$10,000 grant from the Dorothy B. and S. Lawrence Koplovitz Foundation supported the Stepping Stones to Milestones early literacy program.

 CommunityAid granted The Library \$5,000 for bus passes and replacement ID funds to be used by our social work team at the McCormick Riverfront Library. In addition, CommunityAid continues to donate \$300 in gift cards every quarter to be used by people in need at their thrift store.

 Thanks to Neighborhood Assistance Program contributors, the Madeline L. Olewine Memorial Library had a security fence installed and failing windows replaced.

 A Community Development Block Grant from the Dauphin County Department of Community and Economic Development was granted to enable The Library to compensate our social work interns at the McCormick Riverfront Library and open the branch as a warming/cooling station in extreme weather.

 A Tourism Grant from the Dauphin County Department of Community and Economic Development supported promotion of The Library's museum pass program.

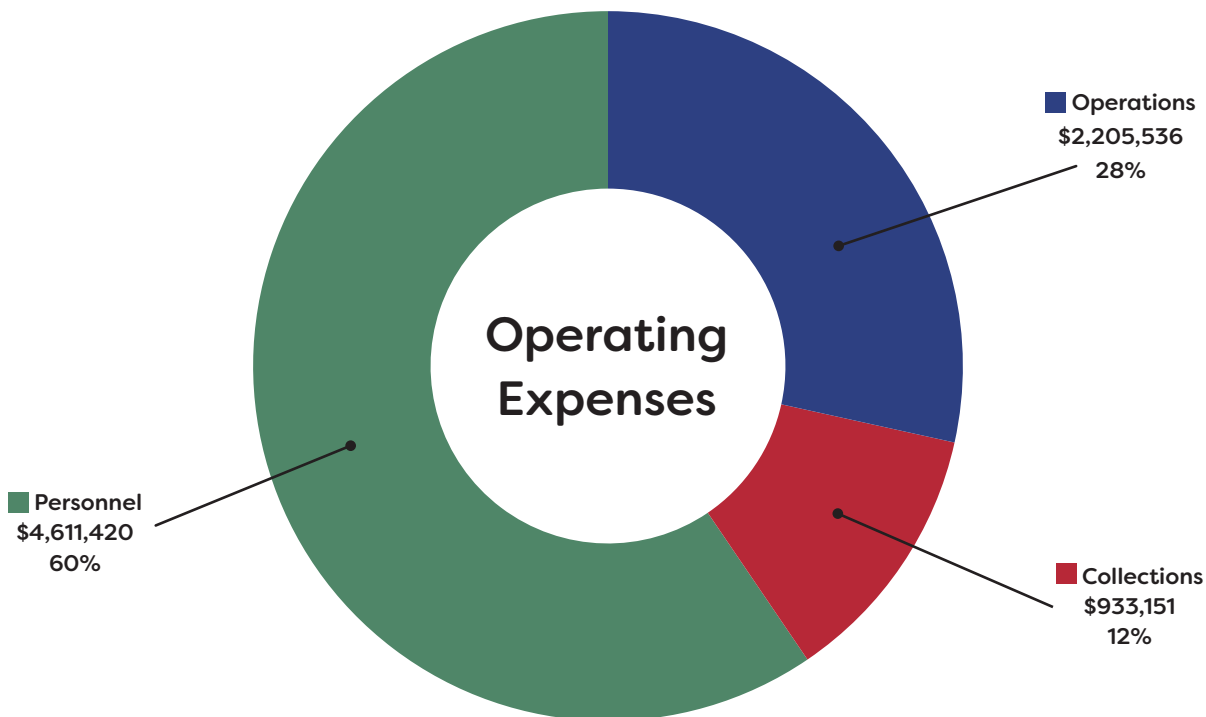
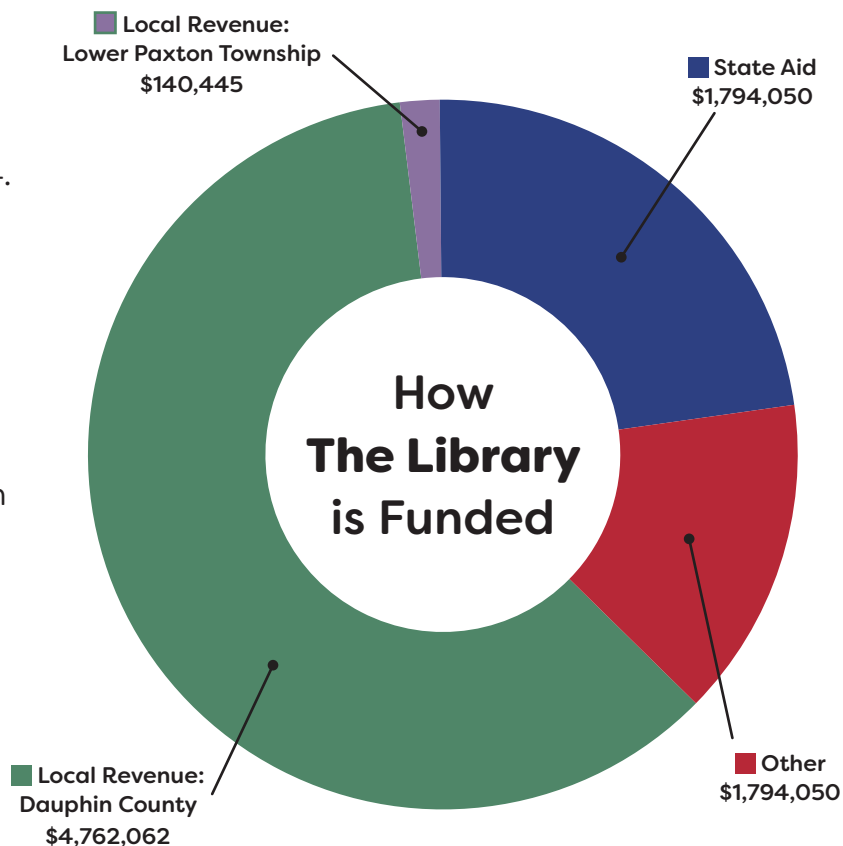

How is The Library Funded?

62.5% of the library's funding comes from two local millages. We received \$4,762,062 from Dauphin County's millage (3.5-mill) which has remained the same since 2004. Lower Paxton's millage (0.41-mill) provided \$140,445 of our local revenue.

\$1,794,050 or 22.9% of funding is provided by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania through the Public Library Subsidy. Pennsylvania remains in the top ten of the nation in providing this type of state-wide support for libraries, yet we've just now returned to pre-recession funding levels.

14.6% or \$1,148,874 comes from a combination of other sources, including interest earned on investments, fees, grants and generous donations from the community.

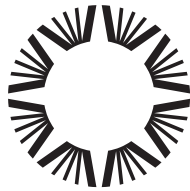
